DURHAM, N.H. -- The University of New Hampshire will host the 1990 New England Wrestling Championships, March 10 and 11, in Lundholm Gymnasium. The meet will feature the best college wrestlers in New England.

Central Connecticut has won the New England title each of the last three years. The Blue Devils are one of the favorites to take the New England title again, along with Boston University. The Terriers won five straight crowns from 1982 through 1986. BU was the runner-up last year, while UNH was third. Also wrestling in the tournament are Boston College, Manhattan, Seton Hall and Wagner.

First round action begins Saturday, March 10, at 10 a.m. The first and second round consolation matches will also be Saturday. The semi-finals are slated for 2 p.m. Saturday.

At 11 a.m. Sunday, New England collegiate coaches will present a clinic for all high school coaches and wrestlers. The consolation finals are slated for 1 p.m., with the Championship finals at 3 p.m.

Tickets for each day of the event are priced at \$2.00 for children and college students with an ID, and \$3.00 for non-students.

DURHAM, N.H. -- The finest collegiate wrestlers in the Northeastern will gather this weekend as the University of New Hampshire hosts the New England Intercollegiate Wrestling Championships. Defending champion Central Connecticut highlights the seven-team field.

Wrestling action begins Saturday at 10 a.m. in Lundholm Gymnasium. The first round consolation matches begin at noon, followed by the semi-finals and the second round consolations. Sunday wrestling begins with the consolation finals at 1 p.m. and the championship finals at 3 p.m. A wrestling clinic for all high school wrestlers and coaches is slated for 11 a.m. Sunday.

Central Connecticut has won the last three New England crowns. Boston University was the runner-up in 1989 and won five straight titles from 1982 through 1986. The Terriers knocked off CCSU in a dual meet this season. Other teams competing in the New England tourney are UNH, Wagner, Seton Hall, Manhattan College and Boston College.

Four wrestlers return to defend their crowns. Returning champions include 126-pounder Sal Profaci, 167-pounder Mike Gibbons and heavyweight Kevin Marriner of Central Connecticut. Garrett Bendel of BU is the returning champ at 134.

Four returning wrestlers were runners-up last year. These include BU 118-pounder Ken Matsui, Wagner heavyweight Pat Versage and 158-pounders Jim Marcotte of UNH and Rocky Urso of Central. Marcotte was the 1989 runner-up at 150, while Urso was second in the 158-pound division.

Central tallied 95.25 points last season and finished with four champions and three runners-up. BU had three champs and two second place finishers, winding up with 76.75 points. UNH had two champions, three runners-up and racked up 67.50 points. Wagner was fourth with one champion, followed by Seton Hall and BC. This is Manhattan's first year in the New Englands.

DURHAM, N.H. -- Coach Jim Urquhart will lead Jim Marcotte into the NCAA Division I Wrestling Championships this week at the University of Maryland. The Championships will be held Wednesday through Friday in College Park, MD.

Marcotte, a junior tri-captain from Plaistow, NH, becomes the 20th UNH wrestler to compete in the NCAA's in Uquahart's 11 seasons as coach of the Wildcats. Marcotte qualified for the nationals by winning the New England Championship in the 158-weight class March 11 at UNH in the New Englands.

Marcotte was the New England runner-up in 1989 and moved up the notch to defeat Rocky Urso of Central Connecticut, 5-4, to win the New England title and earn the coveted berth in the NCAA's. He made a remarkable comeback from injury to rack up a record of 15-8-1 on the season.

DURHAM, N.H. -- Senior Rocco Sorace and junior Jim Marcotte shared the Most Outstanding Wrestler Award at the University of New Hampshire this past year. The pair received their awards at the annual UNH wrestling banquet Saturday night.

Sorace, a heavyweight from Lynbrook, N.Y., posted a 28-10 record this past year and was runner-up in the New England Championships. He finished his career with a record of 45-25-2. He also won the trophy for Most Team Points.

Marcotte, of Plaistow, N.H., wrestled 158 pounds for the Wildcats this past season. He wound up 15-8-1, won the New England title and advanced to the NCAA Championships. He was the Most Outstanding Wrestler in the New England tournament. He also won the award as the Most Dedicated Wrestler at UNH.

Freshman Ken Pera, a 177-pounder from Kensington, Conn., won the trophy for quickest pin (1:23), while freshman Brian Cone, a 118-pounder from Middlebury, VT, won the award for most pins (five).

UNH finished fourth in the New England Championships last month. The Wildcats have sent a wrestler to the NCAA Championships 10 of the last 11 years.
