DURHAM, N.H. -- With a 1-5 record, the University of New Hampshire wrestling team returns to action Saturday afternoon. The Wildcats, having taken on several powerhouses in recent weeks, host Boston College at 3 p.m. in Lundholm Gymnasium.

In its latest outings, UNH was beaten, 43-5, by Columbia and 26-14 by C.W. Post. David Yale had the only victory against Columbia, while freshman Colin Sullivan earned a tie. Yale, Sullivan and freshman Neal Zonfrelli got the wins against Post, while Greg Ludes had a draw.

In six dual meets thus far, Yale has posted a 5-1 mark. He is a junior from Tenafly, N.J. Zonfrelli, a freshman from Bridgewater, Mass., has a 4-1 mark, while sophomore heavyweight Jeff Webb has a 3-1 record.

UNH has been hit hard by injuries and has forfeited the 118 and 126 pound matches in almost every meet this season. Following the Boston College match, UNH travels to Brown for a Jan. 29 showdown. The next home meet is Feb. 2 against Massachusetts.

DURHAM, N.H. -- An almost impossible task faces the University of New Hampshire wrestling team as it attempts to reach the .500 mark before the end of the season. The 5-7-1 Wildcats have only two meets remaining, and one is against New England power Boston University. UNH tackles BU on the road Thursday night and then travels to Maine Saturday morning.

Freshman Neal Zonfrelli, a 190-pounder from Bridgewater, Mass., has posted an 11-1 mark in dual meets thus far. David Yale, a junior 158-pounder, has racked up a 10-3 record thus far. Zonfrelli produced a pin to win the Plymouth State match, 22-19, last week.

Injuries have hurt the Wildcats thus far, but things are looking up. Lou Ferullo, at 126, is back to normal with a 5-1 record. Senior Doug Unger has returned to the line-up at 134 and owns a 3-1 mark thus far. Freshman Rick Berardino has a 9-4 record. Heavyweight Jeff Webb is the only wrestler that remains injured. His status is questionable, and Eric Foulds remains the back-up.
