DURHAM, N.H. -- The University of New Hampshire wrestling team will travel to quadrangular meet at Harvard Saturday. The Wildcats will take on the hosts in addition to William and Mary and WPI. UNH owns a 1-0 dual meet record.

Senior Dave Yale took second place in the 167 pound division in the Coast Guard Invitational meet last week. Yale upped his season record to 9-1. Yale defeated four opponents and lost a 7-6 decision in the finals. He won the Albany State Tournament earlier this season and won the 158-pound New England title last year.

"I was happy with the results of the meet," head coach Jim Urquhart said. "We had quite a few kids do well."

Freshman Dave Beaulieu took fourth place at 118 and upped his season mark to 6-4-1. Sophomore Tim Weckweth was 3-2 in the 158-pound division, while Neal Zonfrelli took fourth at 190.

Following the Harvard quad meet, the Wildcats take almost a month off before taking part in the Maryland Christmas Tourney, Jan. 4-5. During the Christmas vacation, UNH will compete in the Maryland Tournament, a quad meet at Columbia and a Jan. 11 dual with Army.

DURHAM, N.H. -- Fresh off a big win over Boston College, the University of New Hampshire wrestling team prepares itself for the rest of its road matches. The Wildcats tackle Brown Saturday afternoon in the ninth of 15 road matches.

UNH beat BC, 31-15, and does not have a home match until Feb. 18, when it hosts Boston University.

Senior Dave Yale, of Tenafly, N.J., has paced the Wildcats thus far. The 167-pounder has posted a 16-1-1. He now has a career record of 69-26-5 and owns the UNH record for most wins in a career. Yale won the New England title last year and hopes to become the first two-time champion ever at UNH.

Sophomore Neal Zonfrelli and freshman Paul Schwern will also be battling for the top spots in New England. Both wrestlers have 7-5-1 records. Zonfrelli was 15-5 last year and finished third in New England.

DURHAM, N.H. -- This will be a very important week for the University of New Hampshire wrestling team. The Wildcats have won three straight matches and are looking to put themselves over the .500 mark. UNH took a 5-6 record into Wednesday night's meet with the University of Massachusetts and the Wildcats have a quad meet Saturday at Rhode Island College, with Potsdam State and Western New England.

UNH toppled Boston College a week ago and knocked off Brown and Central Connecticut Saturday. The Wildcats beat Brown, 35-8, and edged Central, 22-21, as freshman heavyweight Con Madigan held on for a draw in the final match.

Senior co-captain David Yale, of Tenafly, N.J., registered wins in both matches and now stands 18-1-1 this season. Yale has a career record of 71-26-5 and owns the Wildcat record for most wins in a career.

Sophomore Neal Zonfrelli and freshman Paul Schwern also picked up two wins Saturday. Both wrestlers now carry 9-5-1 records. Schwern competes at 150, Yale at 158 and Zonfrelli in the 190-pound division.

DURHAM, N.H.--Senior David Yale hopes to become the first All-American wrestler from New England in the past three years.

Yale, who came to the University of New Hampshire four years ago from Blair Academy in New Jersey, is currently undefeated in dual meet competition. He holds the Wildcat record for most career wins with 74 and is working towards two other record book entries—most wins in a season and best percentage in a season.

The 167 pound physical education/exercise major says he works out mornings and afternoons to lower his weight to 158 by Feb. 25, the date of the New England Championships at Boston University.

"Aggressiveness is a big thing," Yale says. "You've got to go at the guy and try to intimidate him and get that first takedown."

"You get the first take-down and start working on him," Yale continues, "and he's going to be worried about not getting pinned and just going the distance as opposed to starting to think offensively himself."

Team practices are from four to six every evening, and weight lifting is scheduled at least twice a week. Beyond that, Yale says, it's up to the athletes to train themselves by running or riding the stationary bike.

Head wrestling coach Jim Urquhart says Yale's dedication to the sport is apparent to anyone looking at him.

"Physically, he's put together well," Urquhart says. "There's not many guys at his weight that are built better."

Yale estimates wrestling to be one-third natural skill, one-third conditioning, and one-third mental preparedness.

"With wrestling," the Sigma Beta fraternity brother says, "a lot of it comes from within; how much you want to win. The desire. Because, in the last period, when you're down by one point and your body feels horrible, it's easy to just hang it up. A lot of it's psychological and I really want it."

Yale recalls first becoming exposed to wrestling when he was in junior high school and his brother Steve, four years his senior, was on the high school wrestling team.

"Steve used to always come home and practice his moves on me,"
Yale says, "and that's when I got interested in it."

While in high school, Yale lettered in track and wrestling before transferring to Blair Academy his senior year where he finished his season with a 22-3 record and a third place in the National Prep School Wrestling Championships.

After eight years of wrestling, Yale says he has no regrets about attending UNH instead of wrestling powerhouse Clemson or other sport oriented schools.

"You've got to think where you're going to be after four years,"
Yale explains. "I didn't want to live my life for just wrestling."

With the New Englands over two weeks away, Coach Urquhart believes Yale will perform well. "I don't see him losing the rest of the season," Urquhart says. "He's the odds on favorite at 158 (pounds). He's the man to beat this year."

If all goes well for Yale, then he will compete on March 8-10at the NCAA Championships in East Rutherford, NJ. If Yale places among the top eight competitors in his weight division, he can add NCAA wrestling All-American in the extracurricular activities column of his resume.

"Hopefully, I'll win the New Englands," Yale says, "and therefore qualify for the Nationals and place there. That's my goal. It's not realistic to say I'd like to win, because I didn't place last year.

"I'd like to be an All-American. I think it would be a nice way to end my senior year."

DURHAM, N.H. -- The long-awaited wrestling showdown between Boston University and the University of New Hampshire is here. The Wildcats will host the Terriers Saturday at 7 p.m. These two teams are expected to battle for the New England crown, Feb. 25 and 26.

UNH will bring an 8-8 mark into the contest. The Wildcats crushed Plymouth State and then lost to Springfield last week. Senior co-captain David Yale and 190-pound sophomore Neal Zonfrelli picked up the only Wildcat wins in the 38-8 loss to Springfield.

In the Plymouth State match, Yale and Zonfrelli also picked up victories en route to the 34-7 win. Other UNH winners were Dave Beaulieu, Steve Russell, Paul Schwern, Tim Weckwerth and heavyweight Con Madigan.

Yale is the favorite to win defend his New England 158-pound title. Zonfrelli could move up to heavyweight. Other New England contenders should be Beaulieu at 118 and Schwern at 142. BU has several outstanding wrestlers, including defending New England champions Mike Enzien (134) and Todd Giles (190).

DURHAM, N.H. -- Senior David Yale is looking for All-American honors this weekend at the NCAA wrestling championships. Yale, a two-time New England champion from the University of New Hampshire, must finish in the top eight to become an All-American. Yale is one of three UNH wrestlers that won New England titles and have advanced to the NCAAs.

The NCAA wrestling championships begin Thursday at the Brendan Byrne Arena in the Meadowlands Sports Complex in East Rutherford, N.J.

Yale will bring a record of 31-5-1 into the NCAAs. Freshman 118-pounder Dave Beaulieu has an 18-11-2 mark. He is from Hudson, N.H. The other Wildcat at the NCAAs in sophomore heavyweight Neal Zonfrelli. Moving up from 190 pounds, Zonfrelli won the New England title and improved his record to 16-5-1. He is from Bridgewater, Mass.

DURHAM, N.H. -- Senior David Yale was named the Outstanding Wrestler of the 1984 University of New Hampshire squad. Yale received his award at the annual wrestling banquet Saturday night at the UNH Alumni Center.

Yale, of Tenafly, N.J., turned in a 31-6-2 record this past season and won his second straight New England title. He is the first UNH wrestler to win back-to-back titles. He also set the UNH record for most wins in a season and in a career. In addition, Yale also took home the trophy for most team points scored.

Sophomore Tim Weckwerth won the team's award for Most Improved Wrestler. A native of Hudson, N.H., Weckwerth posted a 17-14 record this past year.

Freshman Dave Beaulieu, also of Hudson, won the award as the team's Most Dedicated Wrestler and also took the trophy for most pins. Beaulieu had a 20-2-2 record this season, including five pins. He is the first UNH freshman to win the New England title.

The trophy for quickest pin went to sophomore Dave Gamer, who shouldered one opponent in 28 seconds.

Neal Zonfrelli, who won a New England title and posted a 17-6-1 record, was named co-captain of next year's squad along with Weckwerth.

DURHAM, N.H. -- Head coach Jim Urquhart has announced that 11 outstanding student-athletes will enroll and wrestle for the University of New Hampshire this fall. UNH posted a 9-9 record last season and finished second in New England. The Wildcats had three New England champions, who represented the school at the NCAA Championships.

Two in-state athletes are among the newcomers. Dave Castricone, of Salem, N.H., won the state championship last year and finished third in the New England High School tournament. He is a 118-pounder. Also headed for Durham is Jim Condon, a 134-pounder from Plaistown, N.H.

Urquhart is bringing in five wrestlers from New York, two from New Jersey and one each from Massachusetts and Rhode Island. At 150 pounds are Steve Kasmouski of Rockland, Mass., and James Durand of Cumberland, R.I. Durand placed in the Rhode Island state tournament. Ken Iwama is a two-time district runner-up. He is a 118-pounder from Rumson, N.J. A 134-pounder from Blair Academy, Eric Hunziker of Westfield, is the other New Jersey recruit.

Leading the New York contingent are a pair of wrestlers from North Babylon. Tim Pescatore was the 1984 Suffolk County champ. He is a 142-pounder. At 190 is Mike Guercio. He placed twice in the Suffolk County Tournament and won the Empire State Games. The other New Yorkers are Paul Dinkelmeir of Commack South, Thomas Orlando of Levittown and Chris Murtha of Shoreham. Dinkelmeir is a 150-pounder, Orlando is at 158 and Murtha is 177. Orlando is a junior college transfer from Nassau Community College, where he won the regional championship. Murtha is a two-time Suffolk County place-winner.

WILDCAT WRESTLING PREVIEW

Head coach Jim Urquhart begins his seventh year as mentor of the Wildcats. A 1974 grad of the University of Rhode Island, Urquhart has coached nine New England champions at UNH. At last year's championships, Urquhart had eight wrestlers place, including two that captured titles.

The 1984-85 Wildcats finished 8-9 during the regular

season and fourth in the New Englands.

Defending New England champions Dave Beaulieu and Tim Weckwerth return to lead the Wildcats this year. Beaulieu captured the 126 title for the second year in a row, while Weckwerth won at 167. Neal Zonfrelli was injured during last year's championships, after winning the heavyweight crown in 1984.

On the season, Beaulieu finished at 16-8-1, while Weckwerth posted a 14-4 mark. Zonfrelli finished at Paul Schwern returns at 150 with a record of 22-8-1 last year.

Two freshmen, Michael Caracci and Curt DiGrigoli, will vie for the 118 spot, while Ken Iwama, last year's 118 moves to 126. Beaulieu makes the jump to 134, with junior Steve Russell also competing. Freshman Robert Anderson, sophomore Eric Hunziker and senior Marc Briere are challenging at 142.

No one appears ready to challenge Schwern at 150, while Dave Gamer and Ted Curley both returns at 158. Weckwerth figures at 167, while senior Rick Berardino, off all of last year, and Dan Shain will compete at Zonfrelli returns at 190, while the heavyweight position will once again be handled by Con Madigan. Madigan was 10-3 last year and placed second at the NE Championships.

UNH had several tough losses last season, among them a 25-23 loss to Central Connecticut and a 26-23 setback by Boston University.

If the Wildcats can remain healthy, Urquhart feels this team could be among the best he has had at UNH.


DURHAM, N.H. -- Dave Beaulieu and Tim Weckwerth will represent the University of New Hampshire at the NCAA Wrestling Championships hosted by Oklahoma State University.

Beaulieu joined David Yale as the only Wildcats to win two New England Champions. A sophomore from Hudson, N.H., Beaulieu won the 126-pound title, beating Chris Lee of Massachusetts in the finals. Beaulieu currently stands 16-7-1 this season. His career record is 36-18-2.

Weckwerth, also from Hudson, is a 158-pound junior. He finished the season with a 14-3 record and is now 33-19-3 in his career. He beat Brett Seamans of Maine, 11-2, in the championship bout.

UNH finished fourth in the New England Championships with 61½ points. Wildcats Dave Gamer and Con Madigan also reached the finals. Two favorites to win New England titles, 150-pounder Paul Schwern and 190-pounder Neal Zonfrelli, did not wrestle for UNH. Schwern had mononucleosis, while Zonfrelli was not fully recovered from a knee injury. Schwern finished with a 17-5-1 mark, while Zonfrelli was 12-3.

Boston University, which had four individual champions, won the New England crown with 78 points. Maine was second with $70\frac{1}{4}$ and Boston College had 62 3/4. Maine and BC also had two individual champions.
