

A CLOSE LOOK AT TODAY'S TEAMS...

DELAWARE/Head Coach Paul Billy: The Blue Hens enter today's tournament with a 1-1 record, including a 48-3 win over Widener and a fifth place finish in the Lafayette Invitational. Dave DeWalt, who was rated fifth in the nation at 177-pounds by the NCAA News, is currently 6-0 with three falls this season. DeWalt, a junior captain who won his second straight Lafayette title this year, is 52-6 with 18 falls in his career. Other Delaware wrestlers to watch are 142-pounder Paul Bastianelli and Dan Neff, who is 5-1-1 at 150-pounds.

SHIPPENSBURG UNIVERSITY/Head Coach Tony Stagliano: Last year's runners-up, the Raider are 0-1 in dual meets but have won the York Tournament. Shippensburg features Terry Lauver, who has won 129 career matches, was a quarterfinalist titles at the York, Millersville and Penn State tournaments, the Raiders return in the NCAA championships at 134 pounds. Besides Lauver, the Millersville Bob McCurdy, who at 177 and 190-pounds is 12-3 and won at the Millersville Tournament.

SALISBURY STATE/Head Coach Ron Otto: The Sea Gulls have not wrestled in any dual meets this season, but have competed in a few quadrangular meets. Jim O'Halloran, Salisbury's heavyweight, is 8-2, including a 15 second pin vs. Coppin State. Lowell Thomas, who has wrestled at 177- and 190-pounds, is 2-0 in the early season.

LAFAYETTE COLLEGE/Barry Snyder: The Leopards are 1-2 entering the tournament, with a win over Moravian and losses to Rutgers and Princeton. Jim Dicker, the defending 190-pound champion and NCAA qualifier is presently 5-1. At 142, Rob Yoos, the Most Valuable Wrestler of this season's Lafayette Invitational, is 6-1 and Leo Greco, the Outstanding Wrestler at the 1983 Delaware Invitational, is 5-1 at 126 pounds.

NEW HAMPSHIRE/Jim Urquhart: The Wildcats are 3-3 in the early going, with wins over Lowell, Hartford and NYU. Paul Schwern has been New Hampshire's most effective wrestler to date, registering a 6-0 record at 150. At 126 pounds Paul Schwern is 3-2 and Dave Gamer is 3-3 at 167 pounds. This is New Hampshire's first appearance in the Delaware Invitational.

GEORGE MASON/Head Coach Michael Connor: The Patriots have started the season strongly, wrestling well in early meets. Dominic Cianchetti, the Patriots' 177-pounder, is 8-2 and junior Pat Spain is 7-3-1 at 126. Troy Emerson, a sophomore 150-pounder is 7-3 and Keith Ball, a sophomore 158-pounder is 7-5-1. A wrestler to watch is junior Wilfredo Leiva who is 5-2 at 118 pounds. This is George Mason's first appearance in the Delaware Invitational.

DREXEL/Head Coach Jack Childs: The Dragons, third place finishers in the 1984 Delaware Invitational, are led by Phil Gottlick (150) and George Kovach (Unl.), a pair of NCAA qualifiers. At 118 pounds, freshman Paul Zarbatany is 12-2 with a third place in the Millersville Tournament. Gottlick is 9-3, including a championship at Millersville. Kovach, a junior, is 9-3 with wins at the Springfield Invitational and a second place finish in the Millersville Tournament.

WILDCAT WRESTLING

HEAD COACH JIM URQUHART

In just ⁵four years, head coach Jim Urquhart has turned the Wildcats into one of the top teams in New England. Last season, Urquhart led his team to a ^{2nd}third place finish in the New England ^{and} for the second year in a row. ^{3 new England champs}

During his reign as coach, Urquhart has had ⁴four New England champions, including Dave Yale and ^{Neal Zonfrelli} Leo Ferullo last year. He had ⁸six wrestlers place in the New England last year.

A 1974 graduate of the University of Rhode Island, Urquhart also received his Master's Degree from URI in 1978. He was a two-time Yankee Conference and New England champion at URI and then was an assistant coach at Brown.

WILDCAT WRESTLING SEASON PREVIEW

New England champ Dave Yale leads a talented group of returnees into the 1983-84 wrestling season. Yale won the NE title at 158 pounds and will move up to 167 this year. Yale owns more wins than any wrestler in Wildcat history.

Other top returnees include NE runner-up Neal Zonfrelli at 190, third place finisher Rick Berardino at 150 and fourth place finishers Dave Berube (134), Colin Sullivan (158) and Ben Schwalb (177). All placers except Schwalb are sophomores this season.

Also returning to the squad this year are sophomores Tim Weckwerth and Darren Young. Co-captain Greg Ludes will also be a major factor.

Freshmen Hugh Gettig and Dave Beaulieu will battle for the 118-pound job. Two more frosh, Eric Gallin and Dan Perkins, lock horns at 126. Berube will have to fight off freshmen Steve Yamone and John Medzorian at 134. Young, soph Marc Briere and freshman Paul Schwern are staging a three-way battle for the 142-pound spot.

At 150, Berardino has the inside track, but soph Dave Gamer and freshman Ted Curley, a state champion in Massachusetts, are gaining rapidly. Sullivan is holding off Weckwerth and freshman Matt Long at 158, while Yale owns the 167 job.

Schwalb, Ludes and freshman Chris Collins have a good fight going for the 177-pound slot. Nobody will take the 190-pound job away from Zonfrelli. The heavyweight spot should fall to Con Madigan, also a Mass. state champ. He is one of the most promising freshmen this year.

HEAD COACH JIM URQUHART

In just five years, head coach Jim Urquhart has turned the Wildcats into one of the top wrestling teams in New England. Last season, Urquhart led his team to a second place finish in the New England Championships. It was the best finish in recent history for the Wildcats, who had three individual champions.

During his reign as head coach, Urquhart has had seven New England champions, including Dave Yale, Dave Beaulieu and Neal Zonfrelli last year. He had eight wrestlers place in the New England last year.

A 1974 graduate of the University of Rhode Island, Urquhart also received his Master's Degree from URI in 1978. A two-time Junior College All-American, he was also a two-time Yankee Conference and New England champion. He began his coaching career as an assistant at URI.

WILDCAT WRESTLING PREVIEW

The Wildcats were second in the New England Championships last year, bettering their third place finish the year before. UNH turned in a 9-9 record last year.

Two-time New England champ Dave Yale graduated, but New England champs Dave Beaulieu and Neal Zonfrelli return. Beaulieu won the 118 title and Zonfrelli took the heavyweight crown.

Beaulieu posted a 20-2-2 record during his freshman year. Zonfrelli was 17-6-1 last year. Beaulieu has moved up to 118, while Zonfrelli should be at 190.

Freshman Ken Iwama is expected to handle the 118 slot, with Beaulieu at 126. Sophomore Dan Perkins and Rick Gallin will also be at 126. Freshmen Fabian LaPointe and Eric Hunziker will battle for the 134 pound slot, while junior Dave Berube will be challenged at 142 by freshman Tim Pescatore.

At 150, several freshmen will try to overtake Paul Schwern. In this group are Paul Dinkelmeyer, Wayne Hauser and Steve Kasmouski. Junior college transfer Tom Orlando will be trying to take the 158 slot from Dave Gamer and Ted Curley.

Dan Shain and Eric Lagerquist are both freshmen at 167. Chris Murtha, at 177, is also a frosh. Co-captain Tim Weckwerth should wrestle the 167 slot, but he has also moved up to 177. With Zonfrelli moving down to 190, Con Madigan should handle the heavyweight chores.

DURHAM, N.H. -- Well, it sounds unbelievable. No one at the University of New Hampshire would mistake Neal Zonfrelli for anything except an extraordinary athlete. He is the defending New England heavyweight wrestling champion and an All-Yankee Conference, All-East linebacker in football.

In light of the junior's accomplishments on the mat, it is interesting to note that he did not plan to wrestle in college. He came to Durham strictly as a football prospect.

"Neal is a very intelligent football player," cites defensive coach Ed Pinkham. "You hear people refer to some players as 'coaches on the field'; that's exactly what Neal is. He's a guide out there and the other players look to him for leadership."

But, wrestling coach Jim Urquhart was not about to let a wrestler of Zonfrelli's ability slide through his fingers without a battle.

"My players say that I have a gift for gab. I think it's the Long Island in me. I knew Neal was a real good wrestler, but the consensus was that he was just going to play football. I waited until football was over and told him that I thought he

could do both. If he liked it, he could stay with it," relates Urquhart.

Evidently, Urquhart has the power of persuasion. He convinced Zonfrelli to give the wrestling circuit a whirl. He has whirled, swirled and hurled himself enough accolades to satisfy even an Orson Wells-type appetite.

"If I wanted to wrestle at the collegiate level, I could. The option was there and the football coaches let me know that," states Zonfrelli.

A native of Bridgewater, Mass., Zonfrelli began wrestling in the seventh grade. His older brother started wrestling first and it was all the younger Zonfrelli could do to escape those moves. But, Zonfrelli took those moves a step further. He recently won the Northern New England Championship and was voted the Outstanding Wrestler of the tournament.

Thus far, he has turned in a 10-1 overall record and a 7-1 dual meet mark. He recently injured his knee and is working hard to come back in time for the New Englands. He is the odds-on favorite to the title, competing at 190 pounds this year. He has registered almost 50 career wins, which places him among the top 10 Wildcat history.

"My ultimate goal is to be an All-American," says Zonfrelli. Now that may seem a bit far-fetched, but not to Urquhart.

"With a combination of some luck and some solid wrestling, Neal could become an All-American," notes Urquhart. To be an All-American, Zonfrelli would have to win the New England and do well at the NCAA Tournament in late March.

The knee injury has been a temporary setback for the Mechanical Engineering major. The knee should be 100 per cent for spring football. Zonfrelli led the Wildcats in tackles last season with 105. He also had two interceptions to lead UNH to a superb 9-2 season. He made a tackle against Connecticut, stopping a two-point conversion attempt and preserving a 13-12 Wildcat victory.

After seeing Zonfrelli on the field or on the mat, one can't help but say "My compliments to the chef."
