The Wildcats had two solid performances last week. In the home opener at Lundholm Gymnasium Wednesday, UNH defeated Lowell, 31-14. Junior Mike Caracci (Great Neck, NY) opened it up with a win at 118, and freshman Pat Napoli (Ridge, NJ) was a victor at 142. Also winning for the 'Cats were Paul Peterson (Sodus, NY) at 167, Nate Baldasaro (Bedford, NH) at 177, and Tom Joy (Wakefield, RI) at 190. Chris Murtha (Shoreham, NY) ended the evening with an impressive pin just 32 seconds into his heavyweight match.

Coach Jim Urquhart's squad didn't cool off at Bowdoin College Saturday. The Wildcats downed the Bears, 43-3. Four different Wildcats won on pins, including Napoli and Joy. Curt DiGrigoli (Great Barrington, MA) was a pin winner at 1:34, and Eric Hunziker (Westfield, NJ) recorded a pin at 1:49 in the 150 class.

After the meet at Seton Hall, UNH will join Rhode Island College at Western New England on Jan. 29 before returning home the following evening to host Fairleigh Dickinson.

DURHAM, N.H. -- A busy week is ahead for the University of New Hampshire wrestling team. The Wildcats will travel to Western New England College along with Rhode Island College Friday, before returning home to Lundholm Gymnasium for a match with Fairleigh Dickinson Saturday at 7 p.m.

The Wildcats improved their mark to 9-1 on the season with a sweep of action in New Jersey Saturday. UNH defeated Kings College, 21-16 before sweeping the day with a 25-9 triumph over Seton Hall.

Junior Mike Caracci (Great Neck, NY) won both his matches in the 188 group to give him five straight victories in dual meet action. Freshman Kevin Beland (Manchester, NH) won both his matches in the 134 group, while freshman Pat Napoli (Ridge, NJ) also won on two pins in the 142 class. Paul Dinkelmeyer (Commack, NY) easily won both his meets in the 158 class. Chris Murtha, the senior from Shoreham, NY, went 2-0 in the heavyweight division.

Other winners in the Seton Hall meet included William Santiago (Brandon, VT) in the 150 and Tom Joy (Wakefield, RI) in the 190 class.

DURHAM, N.H. -- After a second place finish in the Northern New England Championships at Plymouth State last weekend, the University of New Hampshire wrestling team will return to dualmeet action Wednesday at Boston College. The Wildcats will also host Boston University, Springfield and Maine Saturday at Lundholm Gymnasium at 6 p.m.

New Hampshire has a 13-1 record on the season under Coach Jim Urquhart, and need just one victory to tie last season's school record of 14 wins in a season.

Senior Chris Murtha (Shoreham, NY) led the Wildcat cause at Plymouth Saturday. He won all three matches in the heavyweight class, to improve his season slate to 19-3. Freshman Pat Napoli (Ridge, NJ) scored a second place finish in the 142 weight group, while junior Nate Baldasaro (Bedford, NH) also placed second in the 177 weight class.

Other highlights for the Wildcats included a third place finish by sophomore Tom Joy (Wakefield, RI) in the 190, and fourth place finishes by senior Steve Russell (Elmira, NY) at 142 and senior Paul Dinkelmeyer (Commack, NY) in the 158 class.

The Wildcats lost at Boston College, 27-21 Wednesday, then came home to Lundholm Gym for the final home date of the season Saturday. UNH split on the day, defeating Springfield, 22-17 before losing to Boston University, 30-7. The Wildcats stand 14-3 on the season.

Junior Mike Caracci (Great Neck, NY) recorded a win and a draw in Saturday's action, and he now stands 24-5-1 on the season including a 14-1-1 mark in dual-meet action in the 118 class.

Senior Chris Murtha (Shoreham, NY) lost at BC but rebounded with a win over Springfield. He improved his record on the season to 18-4, with a 16-1 slate in dual-meets at heavyweight.

Freshman Pat Napoli (Ridge, NJ) has a 10-7 mark in the 142 class for the Wildcats.

The Wildcats will bring an impressive 14-5 record into Saturday's action against the Black Bears. This will be the Wildcats' final tuneup before they compete in the New Englands at Boston University March 5-6.

In a pair of meets Saturday at Brown, the Wildcats lost to the host school, 33-9, and to Central Conn. State University, 25-19. In the match with Brown, junior Mike Caracci (Great Neck, NY) won in the 118 weight class, while senior Paul Dinkelmeyer (Commack, NY) was a victor at 158. Mark Perkins, a senior from Topsham, ME, battled to a draw in the 167 weight class.

DURHAM, N.H. -- Mike Caracci and Chris Murtha will represent the University of New Hampshire in the 1988 NCAA Wrestling Championships at Iowa State March 17-19.

Caracci and Murtha won New England Championships at the New Englands at Boston University last weekend. Caracci, a junior from Great Neck, NY, defeated Adam Goldstein of Wagner, 10-3 in the finals of the 118 weight class to win his second straight New England title. Caracci became the first Wildcat ever to win a match at the NCAA's last season.

Murtha, a senior from Shoreham, NY, captured the heavyweight title with a 12-3 victory over John Merklinger of Boston College in the finals.

Two other Wildcats came up a bit short in their bids for New England Championships. Freshman Paul Peterson (Sodus, NY) lost to Pat Duffy of BU in the finals of the 150 class, while Paul Dinkelmeyer (Commack, NY) lost in the finals of the 158 weight group to Jim Sloan of Central Conn.

Central Conn. won the New Englands, while host BU finished second and New Hampshire was third. UNH scored more than 20 points more than fourth place Boston College.

Other highlights for Coach Jim Urquhart's squad included third place finishes by senior Steve Russell (Elmira, NY) at 134 and sophomore Tom Joy (Wakefield, RI) at 190.

DURHAM, N.H. -- For the second straight season, the University of New Hampshire wrestling team racked up a school record 14 victories. The Wildcats, boosted by two New England Champions and nine grapplers who recorded 10 or more wins, finished up with a 14-5 record this season.

Coach Jim Urquhart's squad, which has won 39 games in three seasons, featured a 13-1 start and a nine-match winning streak. UNH also placed third in the New Englands, third in the Northern New Englands, third in the Cornell Invitational and fourth in the West Point Invitational.

Two UNH stars who won New England titles represented New Hampshire in the NCAA Championships at Iowa State March 17-20. Junior Mike Caracci (Great Neck, NY) won his second straight New England title and made his second straight NCAA appearance in the 118 weight class. He lost in the preliminary round, but closed out with a 28-6-1 record and an 18-1 dual meet slate. His career mark of 79-24-1 ranks him third all-time, 14 behind Dave Yale and 21 behind all-time leader and former teammate Paul Schwern.

Senior Chris Murtha (Shoreham, NY) closed out a fine career in the heavyweight class. He lost in the prelims of the NCAA's, but did come back in the pigtail consolation before losing to close out at 25-7 on the season. He posted an 18-2 dual meet record. His career mark of 57-36-1 tied (cont.)

his predecessor in the heavyweight class, former teammate Con Madigan, for fifth all-time in victories. Murtha also recorded eight pins to lead the squad.

Sophomore Curt DiGrigoli (Great Barrington, MA) posted an 18-15-1 slate, and won 13 matches in dual meets while competing in the 126 weight group. Senior Paul Dinkelmeyer (Commack, NY) rolled up an 18-9 record and a 13-3 dual slate in the 158 weight class.

Urquhart also got a lot of production out of his fine freshman class. Paul Peterson (Sodus, NY) completed with a 15-5 slate in 150, and an 8-1 dual mark. William Santiago (Brandon, VT) won 13 matches at 142. Newcomer Tom Joy, a sophomore from Wakefield, RI, pulled out 12 wins in the 190 weight class, the weight that Murtha competed in last season.

Junior Nate Baldasaro (Bedford, NH) won 13 matches in the 177 weight class for the Wildcats.

In the past three seasons, Urquhart has guided the Wildcat grapplers to a record of 39-16 while taking four UNH wrestlers to the NCAA Championships.

DURHAM, N.H. -- New England champions Mike Caracci and Chris Murtha walked away with most of the awards at the annual University of New Hampshire wrestling banquet Sunday night. UNH posted a 14-5 record this past season, the best in the school's history.

Caracci, a junior from Great Neck, NY, posted a 28-6-1 record this past season and has a 79-24-1 mark in his career. He was voted Most Dedicated Wrestler and also took home the trophy for most team points. Caracci picked up six pins and five technical falls this year. He is a two-time NE champ at 118 pounds.

Murtha earned three awards, taking the trophies for quickest pin (32 seconds), most pins (eight) and Most Valuable Wrestler. Murtha, a senior heavyweight from Shoreham, NY, was 25-7 this past year and 57-36-1 for his career. He and Caracci both advanced to the NCAA Championships in Iowa.

Paul Dinkelmeyer, a senior from Commack, NY, captured the award as most improved wrestler. Dinkelmeyer closed out his career with a 29-39 mark, but was 18-8 this past season. Other wrestlers who had good years were 126 pounder Curt DiGrigoli (18-15-1), 134-pounder Steve Russell (10-7), 142-pound freshman Pat Napoli (9-7), 150-pound freshman William Santiago (13-8-4), 158-pound freshman Paul Peterson (15-5), 177-pounder Nate Baldasaro (13-9) and 190-pounder Tom Joy (12-12-2). Murtha, Dinkelmeyer and Russell are the key losses for next year's squad.
